
Arboretum Bridge and Trail Capital Trails Symposium November 2019





- The Arboretum Bridge and Trail project is currently in design.
- The project will create a new multi-use trail crossing over the Anacostia River to connect to US National Arboretum in Ward 5 with Kenilworth Park in Ward 7.
- This trail segment is approximately 1/2 mile long, including the proposed 400foot bridge.


What stage of planning/design is this project in?

- The project is currently at the 30% design stage, which was presented to the community in May of this year.
- DDOT is negotiating a contract change order with the designer so that design can continue to the 65% stage.
- The schedule will depend on when this contract change is completed.



What's notable or exciting about the project?

- This trail segment is part of the Anacostia River Trail network
- It will provide a needed and missing direct connection between neighborhoods near the US National Arboretum and neighborhoods of Mayfair, Parkside, Eastland Gardens and Kenilworth.
- This segment was part of the 2003 Anacostia Waterfront Framework Plan.



What the project needs from audience / Capital Trails Coalition to move it forward

- DDOT will be seeking public input at the 65% design stage (date TBD).
- This next step in design will address comments received from the 30% design that has been previously shared.
